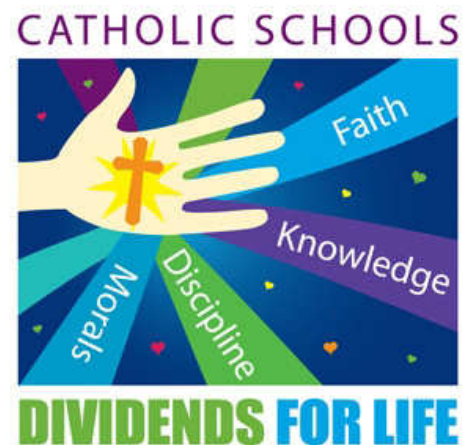
Students whose grandparents cannot attend will be treated to doughnuts in the classroom.

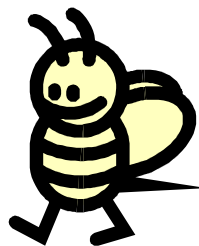
